

Have fun colouring in the insects, animals and nature found at Brent Cross Town.

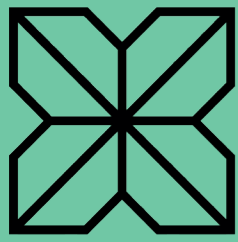


Find a spot to sit quietly for one minute. Close your eyes and listen. How many different sounds can you hear? Write down what you can hear below.

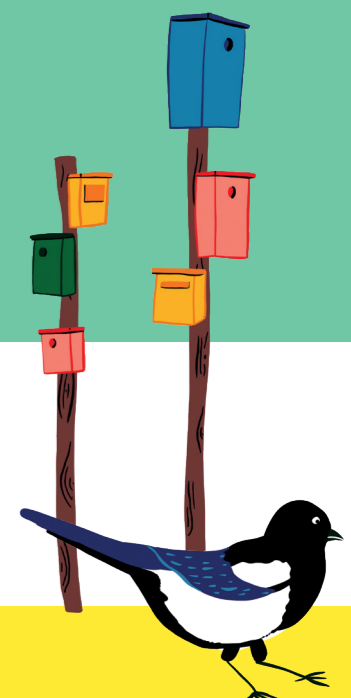

3 Look carefully at the flowers and planters. I'm a tiny insect with bright red wings and black spots. You might spot me resting on a leaf or petal. What am I?



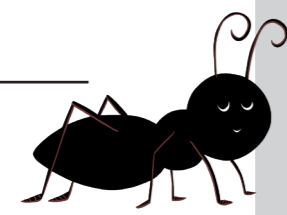
Woodland
Along the edges of the park, woodland areas provide a dense tree line, creating rich habitats for local wildlife and creating a calm, natural environment.

7 My branches are long and thin and droop gracefully towards the water. I'm often found beside ponds and rivers. What type of tree am I?

8 I'm a cheerful yellow flower with a trumpet-shaped centre. I'm one of the first flowers to bloom in spring and a sign that warmer days are coming. What am I?
